The group then got to experience the Planetarium at Dickinson College before finishing out the day listening to a presentation by Kelly McGinley, Principal of Function & Flow. She presented "Start with Better Meetings" where the fellows learned how to avoid common meeting mishaps and discovered the 5-Step Better Meetings Method.
