Rob Pepper with Messiah University presented on Ethical Leadership to show how decisions are shaped by legal boundaries as well as professional guidelines and moral stances. A case study was done on Ethical Leadership with Cara Curtis with the Cumberland County Historical Society on the Carlisle Indian School.

After lunch, the Fellows heard from an Elected Leadership Panel moderated by Jason Maddux with the United Way of Carlisle & Cumberland County. 

Carlisle Area Healthcare Auxiliary (CAHA) - VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES


