Our JLC students met for the first time in 2024 this month at Members 1st Federal Credit Union's Headquarters in Enola. They started off with an ice breaker activity and presentation by Coach Mike Greene of Integrity Works Coaching on Stephen Covey's Habit 4: Think Win-Win. They then broke into groups to take a tour of Members 1st FCU's building and hear a presentation on College Prep from Donovin Lindsay of College Knowledge.

Then they were able to listen to a Panel of Elected Officials including: Jessica Brewbaker, Cumberland County Judge; Timothy L. DeFoor, M.S., PA State Auditor General; Anne Lauritzen, Carlisle School Board; and Representative Patty Kim, State Representative for the 103rd District. The panel gave advice to the students about how to inspire change in their communities and the importance of voting. After lunch and to finish out the day they did their Community Service with Radiant Hope, where they packed bottles with needed items and gift cards to be handed out to individuals and families affected by cancer.

Then the group heard from Dan Jensen, with Harrisburg University of Science and Technology on Decision Making Models, and after lunch and exchanging Valentine's with the class they heard a presentation on Nonprofit Fundraising by Cate Mellen, CFRE, Director of Development with United Way of Carlisle & Cumberland County.

To finish out the day they worked on planning the Nonprofit Volunteer Fair that will be taking place in March along with hearing from a panel moderated by Jason Maddux of United Way of Carlisle & Cumberland County on Rapid Growth of the County. The panel consisted of Mary Kuna, Executive Director of The Cumberland County Housing and Redevelopment Authority, Kirk Stoner, Director of Planning of Cumberland County, PA, Mike Coopey, Assistant Superintendent of the Carlisle Area School District, Laura Potthoff, Business Development Office with F&M Trust; and Neil Leary, Director for Center for Sustainability Education at Dickinson College.
