Thank you to our session and host sponsor Members 1st Federal Credit Union for having our students and encouraging the development of their leadership skills.

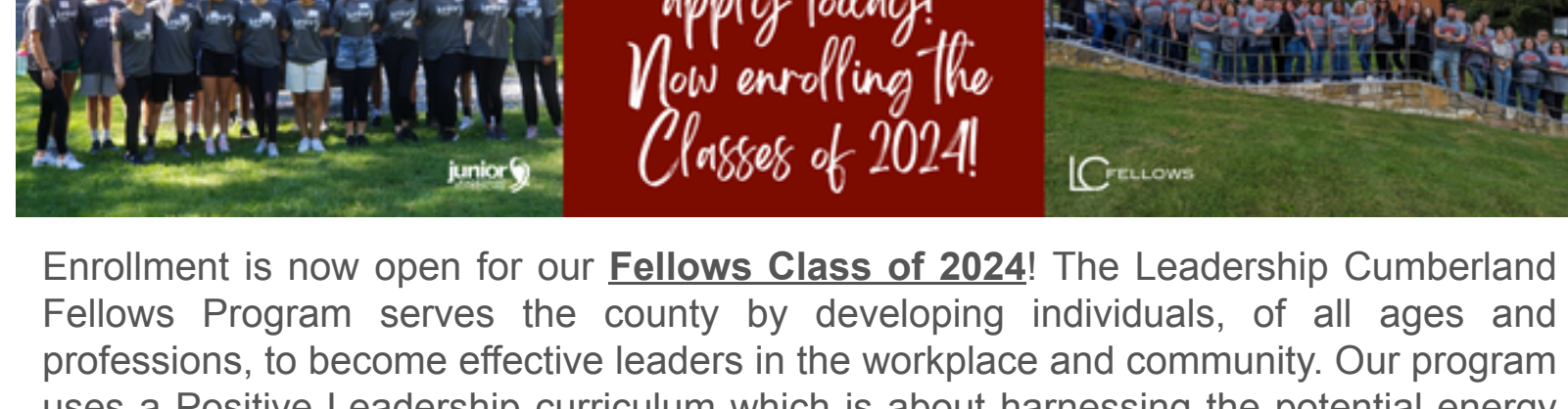
### LC Fellows Learn Compassionate Listening & Decision Making In February Class

Enrollment is now open for our **Fellows Class of 2024!** The Leadership Cumberland Fellows Program serves the county by developing individuals, of all ages and professions, to become effective leaders in the workplace and community. Our program uses a Positive Leadership curriculum which is about harnessing the potential energy when people come together. It focuses on seven timeless capacities: Authenticity, Purpose, Advocacy, Resilience, Community-Building, Reason, and Gratitude.

Fellows participate in a ten-month program, from September through May, including a two-day retreat and day-long classes each month designed to address the identified outcomes above. Class sessions are held on the third Thursday of the month at various host locations around the County. Fellows also complete a board internship, serving as host-voting board members for a nonprofit of their choice. These experiences are then integrated into the class discussions.

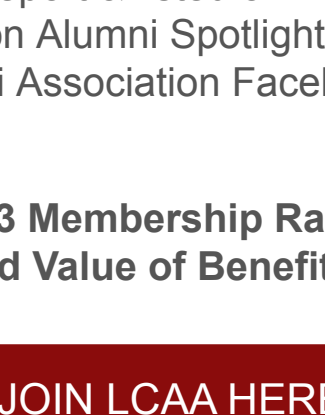
